THIS IS TO CERTIFY that a draft Bill entitled **DATA PROTECTION AND PRIVACY BILL, 2015** has been examined and I wish to report as follows:

a) That the Bill has the following objectives:

- i. To protect the privacy of individuals and of personal data by regulating the collection and processing of personal information.
- ii. To provide the rights of the person whose data is collected and the obligations of the data collectors, data processors and data controllers.
- iii. To regulate the use and disclosure of personal information; and for related matters.

b) That it is expected to have the following impact on the economy:

The resultant law will promote the protection and privacy of personal data as enshrined under Article 27 of the constitution. This will promote increased confidence by citizens when transacting in various forms especially where they may be required to disclose their personal data.

c) Funding and budgetary implications

That all expenses incidental to the application of the subsequent law will be accommodated within the provisions of the Medium Term Expenditure Framework (MTEF) for the Information and Communications Technology Sector.

d) Expected benefits (savings and revenues)

Revenues will accrue to Government as Non Tax Revenue from Fees on Registration of Data Collectors and Processors. No savings are anticipated to accrue from enactment of the legislation.
