**THIS IS TO CERTIFY** that the National Sports (Amendment) Bill, 2024 has been examined and I wish to report as follows:

**a) That the Bill has the following objective:**

To align the provisions of the National Sports Act, Cap. 151 relating to anti-doping with the World Anti-Doping Code and to provide for related matters.

**b) That it is expected to achieve the following major outputs:**

The National Sports (Amendment) Bill, 2024 will align the National Sports Act with the World Anti-Doping Code to allow for smooth participation of Uganda in International Sports Competitions.

**c) Funding and budgetary implications:**

The planned funding of UShs. 2.0bn will be accommodated within the budgetary provisions and the Medium-Term Expenditure Framework of Vote 013 – Ministry of Education and Sports and Vote 166 – National Council of Sports.

**d) Expected savings and/or Revenue to Government:**

The projected expenditures under the National Sports (Amendment) Bill, 2024 include operational cost to run the National Anti-Doping

*"To formulate sound economic policies, maximize revenue mobilization, ensure efficient allocation and accountability for public resources so*

**e) Impact on the economy:**

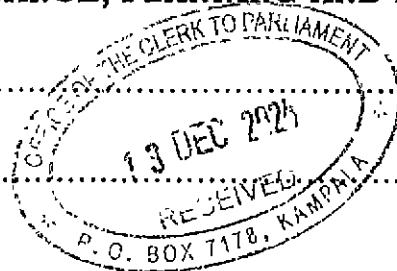
