### FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS

(Made under S.76 of the Public Finance and Management Act, Cap. 171)

**THIS IS TO CERTIFY** that the Energy Efficiency and Conservation Bill, 2024 has been reviewed.

I wish to report as follows:

### a) That the Memorandum has the following main objective;

To seek approval by Parliament for the Energy Efficiency and Conservation Bill, 2024.

### b) Objectives of the Bill include:

- i. To regulate the efficient and rational use of energy in Uganda;
- ii. To enhance and promote energy efficiency and conservation in Uganda; and
- iii. To avoid wasteful use of energy and ease the burden of energy costs on the economy and environment.

# c) Planned Expenditure over the MTEF period:

The planned expenditure of **UShs. 22,770,000,000** will be accommodated within the Medium Term Expenditure Framework (MTEF) of the Ministry of Energy and Mineral Development (MEMD) under the Sustainable Energy Development Programme. Therefore, there will be no additional financial implications to Government of Uganda.

# d) Funding and Budgetary implications:

The estimated cost for implementation of the Energy Efficiency and Conservation Bill, 2024 is **UShs. 22,770,000,000 (Uganda Shillings Twenty-Two Billion Seven Hundred Seventy Million** 

**only)** for the first five years. These funds are to cater for the following interventions:

- i. Inclusion of energy efficiency mechanisms and standards in buildings for large energy consuming enterprises;
- ii. Inclusion of clean cooking technologies such as electric pressure cookers and promotion of Energy Service Companies (ESCOs) to stimulate demand for energy efficiency investments;
- iii. Support to the development and implementation of regulations to guide execution of the Act;
- iv. Addition of testing equipment for cooking appliances and freezers.

# e) Expected Savings and/or Revenue to Government:

When enacted, the Law will generate Non-Tax Revenue mainly through licenses issued and penalties on offenders of energy efficiency standards as stipulated in Section 43 – 49 of the proposed Bill.
