I wish to report as follows:

a) That the Memorandum has the following Objective:

To seek approval by Parliament for the Uganda National Examinations Board (UNEB) Bill, 2020.

b) Specific Objectives of the Bill include:

- To reform the law to provide for the Uganda National Examinations Board to regulate and oversee the national examinations;
- To harmonize the Uganda National Examinations Board Act with other existing government laws and policies;
- To define the powers and functions of the Uganda National Examinations Board with regard to preparation, organization and administration of national examinations;
- To improve the standards and quality of national examinations conducted by the Examination Board; and
- To address new and emerging challenges affecting the administration and management of national examinations.


d) Impact on the economy:
