THIS IS TO CERTIFY that The Uganda National Commission for UNESCO (Amendment) Bill, 2024 has been examined and I wish to report as follows:

a) That the Bill has the following objectives:

The intention of the Bill, therefore, is to amend or repeal several Acts of Parliament to:

- i) enable the merging, mainstreaming and rationalization of the Uganda National Commission for UNESCO thereby, *inter alia*, relieving the Government of the financial drain on its resources and the burden of wasteful administration and expenditure;
- ii) facilitate efficient and effective service delivery by clearly delineating the mandates and functions of the Uganda National Commission for UNESCO, thereby avoiding duplication of mandates and functions;
- iii) promote coordinated administrative arrangements, policies and procedures for: ensuring the efficient and successful management, financial accounting and budgetary discipline of government agencies and departments; enabling the Government to play its proper role more

effectively; and enforcing accountability; and

- iv) to restructure and re-organize agencies and departments of Government by eliminating bloated structures and functional ambiguities in Government agencies and departments.

b) That it is expected to achieve the following major outputs:

- i) The Uganda National Commission for UNESCO Act, 2014 amended to abolish the Board of the Uganda National Commission for UNESCO established by section 7 of Act 6 of 2014, remove the corporate status of the Uganda National Commission for UNESCO and make the Ministry responsible for education the secretariat for the Uganda National Commission for UNESCO.

c) Funding and budgetary implications

They are no related costs to implementation of the Uganda National Commission for UNESCO (Amendment) Bill, 2024.

d) Expected savings and/or Revenue to Government:

The Uganda National Commission for UNESCO (Amendment) Bill, 2024 is budget neutral, there will be no monetized savings.

e) Impact on the Economy

Since the Ministry responsible for Education will be the Secretariat for the Uganda National Commission for UNESCO, there will be an integrated control processes to ensure greater consistency in program implementation which will lead to standardized procedures and regulations.
