# PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO THE NATIONAL COFFEE BILL 2018 BY HONOURABLE KABANDA BABIRYE MARY / HON. SARAH WEKOMBA

# **CLAUSE 14: BOARD OF THE AUTHORITY**

In sub clause (2)-

- (a) delete paragraph (f);
- (b) insert a new paragraph immediately after paragraph (k) as follows-

"two representatives appointed by the Minister from recognised women coffee growers associations"

#### justification,

- Already there is a representative from the Ministry of agriculture making the representative from the NARO, redundant and unnecessary.
- to bring on board technical capacity to articulate issues of women in the coffee value chain.

#### **CLAUSE 15 - DISQUALIFICATION FROM APPOINTMENT**

In clause 15, substitute for the word "who" the words "if such a person"

## **Justification**

• For clarity and better drafting

#### **CLAUSE 26: REGISTRATION OF COFFEE FARMERS**

Clause 26 should be amended by-

- (a) By deleting sub clause (2) (b); and
- (b) inserting a new sub clause immediately after sub clause (2) as follows-

"Where a person registered as a coffee farmer in subsection (1) is married, the registration of that person as a coffee farmer shall extend to that person's spouse."

#### **Justification**

- Clause 26 (2) (b) is impracticable since UCDA has no capacity on timely evaluation which will cause delays on the work of the farmers, create shortage.
- The provision does not take into account the fact that land can be improved to make it suitable for growing coffee.
- It has the effect of taking away the rights of any person to use their land as they wish.
- The requirement to extend the registration of a farmer to his or her spouse is to recognise women rights and ensure equitable sharing of decisions and resources.

#### **CLAUSE 42: DOMESTIC CONSUMPTION OF COFFEE**

Clause 42 is amended by substituting for sub clause (1) the following-

"(1) the Authority shall promote and support the domestic and foreign consumption of Uganda coffee."

#### Justification

• To obligate the Authority to promote the consumption of Ugandan coffee locally and internationally.

## **CLAUSE 44: LEVY IN COFFEE EXPORT**

In clause 44, substitute for the word "two" the word "one"

#### **Justification**

• Charging 2% on coffee exports is not realistic and is an impediment to the development of the coffee subsector in Uganda.

#### **CLAUSE 54: OFFENCES AND PENALTIES**

In clause 54,

(a) delete sub clause (1) (d);

# **Justification**

- The offence is ambiguous and does not comply with the legality principle since the ingredients of the offence are not prescribed so that a person knows which conduct is prohibited;
- the provision creates fear, it's not realistic, it curtails farmers rights and freedoms, because people abandon coffee farms for genuine reasons;
