ENTITLED.

THE NATIONAL TEXTILES BOARD (REPEAL)  
STATUTE, 1991.

**A Statute to provide for the repeal of the National Textiles Board Decree, 1974 to facilitate for the dissolution of the National Textile Board and to vest the ownership of certain companies engaged in the textile industry to the Government and former shareholders and to provide for other connected matters.**

BE IT ENACTED by the President and the National Resistance Council as follows:—

1. This Statute may be cited as the National Textiles Board (Repeal) Statute, 1991 and shall come into operation on such date as the Minister may, by statutory instrument, appoint. Short title.

2. In this Statute, unless the context otherwise requires: Interpretation.

“Board” means the National Textiles Board established by the National Textiles Board Decree 22 of 1974; Decree 22 of 1974.

“Minister” means the Minister responsible for Industry and Technology.

Return of companies to former owners.

**3.** The companies set out in Part I of the Schedule to this Statute are hereby returned to the owners correspondingly set out in the second column to that part of the Schedule.

Transfer of companies to Government.

**4.** The companies set out in Part 11 of the Schedule to this Statute are hereby vested in the Government and shall be managed by the Minister of Industry and Technology.

Joint Ownership.

**5.** The companies set out in Part 111 of the Schedule to this statute shall be jointly owned by the Government and other shareholders a list of which may be obtained from the Ministry of Industry and Technology.

Minister may order payment of commissions and management.

**6.** Notwithstanding the provisions of sections 3, 4 and 5 of this Statute, the Minister may direct that any of the companies specified in the Schedules to this Statute shall pay such contribution by way of commissions and management fees as may still be owing to the Board up to the date of coming into force of this Statute to off-set the Board’s liabilities.

Receivers.

**7.** The Minister shall appoint not less than three and not more than seven public trustees to act as receivers in the process of the dissolution of the Board.

Repeal of Decree 22 of 1974.

**8.** The National Textiles Board Decree, 1974 is hereby repealed.
